

At last - Carshalton Ponds Railings completed

The long-awaited Carshalton Pond Railings replacement/rebuilding works are now completed after years of campaigning by the local Lib Dem Team.

Subsequently, night-time road resurfacing works have been taking place in mid-to-late March, along the A232 Red Route between North Street and Alma Road, causing further traffic diversions.

Meanwhile, local Lib Dem councillors have been chasing Transport for London (TfL) to try and get them to divert the existing buses to stop in the grounds of the refurbished Westcroft Centre when it opens in the late autumn of2012. It is hoped that users of the Centre/Library will increasingly wish to use public transport facilities. We are also following up your concerns with TfL about late running of the 407 bus along Carshalton Road.

Policing and Shorts Road-West Street Alley

Following requests by the local FOCUS team, police officers made visits to the alleyway between Shorts Road and West Street to tackle dog owners who fail to pick up the mess left by their pets.

Although the officers didn't see any offenders to issue £50 fines, they talked to lots of dog owners and handed out leaflets about responsible dog ownership.

Over recent weeks officers have carried out patrols in Carshalton Park, The Grove Park, Carshalton, and the Shorts Road alleyway. Police are urging members of the public to report any owners who fail to pick up after their pets.
