Cllr. Jill Whitehead says: "Your councillors and resident representatives recently met the Football Club Chairman (CAFC) to discuss plans for a new all-weather football pitch, to replace the current earth pitch.

The club intend to submit a planning application to Sutton Council, with building starting in 2014. They plan to replace current training activity in Wrythe Rec. with activity on the all-weather pitch within the ground, thus reducing traffic and parking stress along Brookfield Avenue."

Cllr. Alan Salter adds: "In order to reduce parking and traffic stress in the Colston Avenue area, the club plans to seek double yellow lines and road signage for its entrance in Colston Avenue, and also direct visitors to park in an alternative large car park at the rear of the ground next to the nature reserve. We have asked the club to look at ways to protect residents in Mead Crescent from noise and light problems. CAFC have sought residents' views on their proposals."

Cllr. Hamish Pollock says: "We have also just been alerted to plans by the Girls School to build a new sports hall, on the site near the Football Club. This could put extra parking pressure on residents in Brookfield Avenue, who have already commented to us about parking, lighting and noise problems."

Cllr. Jill Whitehead says: "We are pleased that the council recently installed double yellow lines along the side of Shorts Road by St. Philomena's School walls. This follows complaints from residents and the fire brigade about the road being blocked by inconsiderate parking." Cllr. Hamish Pollock adds: "The yellow lines work follows some discussion at our recent Local Committee meeting."
